



Q1 Statistical Report 2021 Summary

Overall Quarter One Observations

- Calls were received from all four UK Countries and spanned 36 police forces across England.
- As has been consistently reported, Romania was the highest recorded potential victim nationality for England (39). The highest recorded nationality for Scotland was also Romania (5).
- March saw the highest number of calls and webforms in Quarter One. March 2021 showed a 6% increase in calls and a 21% increase in webforms as compared to February 2021. As lockdown restrictions ease, contacts into the helpline are gradually increasing.



Over the past 3 months the Helpline received 1857 Helpline calls, webforms and app submissions. After the holidays, the helpline calls have increased each month, with a 21% increase in March 2021 as compared to January 2021. March also showed a significant increase in webform submissions, 21% increase versus the prior month in February.



In Quarter One, each month saw an increase in the number of modern slavery cases opened, with March as the highest. March had 56% higher cases of exploitation assessed than January. However, the most potential victims were indicated on February cases. Modern slavery cases and potential victims are not always directly proportionate; one case may indicate multiple potential victims.







Indicators of modern slavery reported to the Helpline include, but are not limited to, passport confiscation, little or no pay, debt bondage, isolation, monitoring and physical abuse. The Helpline continues to field a significant number of reports of potential labour abuse, which may include: failure to pay national minimum wage, employment contract concerns, inability to take breaks or leave, dangerous working conditions, harassment at the work place. General information cases may relate to requests for Helpline materials and media interviews.


Labour exploitation is repeatedly the most common type of exploitation reported. After labour exploitation, sexual and criminal exploitation remain the next most commonly reported. 'Various' is selected when more than one type of exploitation is reported. Cases with 'unknown' exploitation type may result from a technical assistance call with a professional dealing with a victim where the specific details of the exploitation type are not disclosed on the call.






The number of referrals and signposts increased by 32% compared to last quarter with the highest amount since launch in 2016. This increase is due to a whopping 72% increase in signposts. These include actions on Non-MS and labour abuse. Cases may have more than one referral or signpost.

Proximity of Caller to the Victim(s) in Modern Slavery Cases




This quarter saw aa 19% increase in the number of cases where a victim self-reported Almost three-fourths (73%) of modern slavery cases either involved a report from someone in direct contact with the victim (45%) or the victim themselves (28%).

Callers in direct contact with a victim may include an NGO, friends or family of the potential victim, health professional, police, or social services. Indirect contact is recorded where the caller knows of the situation or the individual involved. 'Observation of suspicious activity' refers to third party tip offs, where often limited information is known.




Drugs and begging continue to be the most commonly involved activities for cases of criminal exploitation. This quarter also included activities associated with shoplifting.

Gender of Potential Victims of Modern Slavery



The gender of potential victims is recorded by the Helpline where this is provided by the caller. If the caller is unable to specify the gender of indicated victims, 'unknown' is recorded.

Age of Potential Victims of Modern Slavery



Potential victims' ages are recorded based on caller information. If the caller does not know the age of the victim, 'unknown' is recorded. In all cases, the Helpline seeks to establish if a minor is involved in a situation.



The Helpline may receive multiple calls about one case. Calls relating to cases of modern slavery reportedly occurring in England are recorded above, even though the caller may be calling from another country. Sometimes callers speak in general terms about cases in England but may not specify a particular area or location.

Along with calls on modern slavery cases, the 582 calls reported above may also be for non-modern slavery, labour abuse, or general information cases with a reported caller location of England.

The pie chart on the right shows a breakdown of the situations assessed to be modern slavery. This quarter shows a percentage breakdown of exploitation that is largely similar to the prior quarter. Similar to the overall picture, labour remains the most common form of exploitation with sexual and criminal exploitation the next most frequently reported.












Type of Exploitation




This quarter reflects a striking 75% increase in calls as compared to the prior quarter (24) and a 77% increase in the number of potential victims of modern slavery indicated. The demographics of potential victims are more diverse with an additional two more nationalities reported. Interestingly though, the number of modern slavery cases as well as the breakdown of types of exploitation are almost the same.





While this quarter saw a 135% increase in the number of calls and 67% increase in the number of webforms compared to the prior quarter, the picture of what was reported is significantly different with reduced cases of modern slavery and potential victims indicated.





Type of Exploitation




As compared to the prior quarter (quarter four 2020), in quarter one 2021 the MSEH recorded 12 times as many helpline calls related to Northern Ireland cases which resulted in three times as many modern slavery cases and five times as many potential victims indicated. Quarter Four 2020 recorded one helpline call, 1 case of modern slavery and 1 potential victim for cases related to Northern Ireland.
