The Modern Slavery & Exploitation Helpline is run by Unseen, a UK charity working to eradicate slavery. We are independent and confidential and offer information and resources about modern slavery to potential victims, businesses, NGOs, the public and statutory agencies in the UK.

With millions already forcibly displaced due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine, we are concerned that more people could be caught up in modern slavery and human trafficking, which is always the way when many vulnerable people are on the move.

- The Helpline is open 24/7, 365 days a year and anyone is welcome to contact us whether they are a member of the public, a professional or someone who thinks they may be a potential victim of modern slavery or labour exploitation.
- Call: 08000 121 700 calls from the UK are free but calls from outside the UK may incur
 charges. We can connect interpreters in over 200 languages. Your call will be answered
 by a trained advisor who will be ready to help.

6. signposts for refugees seeking employment in the uk

7. safety planning

- If you or anyone you know is in immediate danger, call the 112 European emergency number. The number is free of charge, 24/7 and can be used anywhere in Europe including the UK. Dial 112 to reach the emergency services, including the police, emergency medical services and the fire brigade.
- In the UK, dial 999 for emergency services (police, fire, medical and coastguard), 101 for police in non-emergency situations, and 111 for help with an urgent medical problem and you are unsure what to do.
