



# quarter one statistical report 2024 summary

- The Helpline received reports of 246 modern slavery cases occurring in the United Kingdom this quarter with 669 potential victims indicated.
- Zimbabwean was the most recorded nationality of potential victims of modern slavery in the United Kingdom (72), followed by Chinese (51), Indian (30) and Nigerian (20).
- There were 11 modern slavery cases reported in Wales this quarter, a 57% increase from quarter four 2023.





Indicators of modern slavery reported to the Helpline include but are not limited to; passport or document confiscation, little or no pay, debt bondage, isolation, monitoring, and physical abuse. The Helpline continues to field a significant number of reports of potential labour abuse, which may include failure to pay national minimum wage, employment contract concerns, inability to take breaks or leave, dangerous working conditions and harassment at the workplace. General information cases may relate to requests for Helpline materials and media interviews.

'Unknown' cases mav have resulted from a technical assistance call with a professional dealing with a victim where the specific details of the exploitation type were not disclosed on the call.



The Helpline may be contacted multiple times about one case, and the total number of calls, online reports and app submissions include reports relating to all case types. For example, modern slavery, labour abuse, non-modern slavery, general information and non-substantial.

#### modern slavery potential victim demographics










#### top 10 modern slavery potential victim nationalities




#### modern slavery potential victim demographics











The table and graph show the number of top ten most indicated potential victims by country of exploitation. The number of modern slavery cases/potential victims may not equal the total number of modern slavery cases when summed by country as a single case can involve multiple countries, and a potential victim may have experienced exploitation in more than one country.
